Dr Seif Salem Al-Abri studied medicine at Sultan Qaboos University in Oman and qualified in 1993. He has done his training in Infectious diseases at the Royal Liverpool University hospital and Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine, Liverpool, UK. He became a fellow of Royal College of Physicians in 2008.

Dr Al-Abri is a practicing consultant in Infectious Diseases at the Royal hospital, Oman and he was the head of infectious diseases department from 2006 until 2014. He was appointed head of medicine at Royal Hospital in 2009, and in 2014 he was appointed as the Director General for Disease Surveillance and Control at the Ministry of Health of Oman.

Dr Al-Abri has interest in medical education and he is an accredited Royal College of Physicians educator; he is an international advisor for the Royal College of Physicians of London and the Lead Examiner for the MRCP (UK) Examination in Oman from 2011 until 2015, and he is the chairman of the Governing Council of Oman Medical College. In addition, he is an associate editor to Sultan Qaboos University Medical Journal, Journal of Infection and Public Health, and Annals of Clinical Microbiology and Antimicrobials.
