Professor Graham Jackson Biography

He graduated from Cambridge and the Westminster School of Medicine. He gained his MRCP in 1986 and then moved to Newcastle University to undertake his MD, which he completed in 1992. Prof Jackson obtained his MRCPPath in 1993, followed by his FRCP in 1999 and his FRCPPath in 2000.

Throughout his career, Prof Jackson has received a number of awards, including special fellowship to the European School of Haematology and European Community Fellowship to the European School of Oncology. He has won the Van Bekkum medal at the EBMT and has been awarded the BSH gold medal.

He is a former president of the BSH and the BSBMT and serves on the council of the RCPPath. He has served on CTAAC and on the Blood wise clinical trials committee. He is a director of Myeloma UK and scientific secretary for the UKMF. He has been CI on the MRC Myeloma 9 and 11 and is currently the CI for myeloma 11+. He is part of the safety monitoring committee for all the MUK trials as well as Internationally the Carfilizomib trials. His research interests focus on clinical trials and safety in the treatment of myeloma, development of long-term bone marrow transplant follow-up clinics, and the cytokine profile of acute and chronic graft-versus-host disease.

He has always been passionate about good doctor-patient communication and has been involved in many 'breaking bad news' training seminars. He has published over 200 peer reviewed papers as well as many book chapters and reviews.
